The DoD National Defense Science and Engineering Graduate (NDSEG) Fellowship Program was established in 1989 by direction of Congress and sponsored by the Army, Navy and Air Force. The program is a highly competitive fellowship awarded to qualified U.S. citizens, U.S. nationals, and U.S. dual citizens who intend to pursue a Doctoral degree in one of the disciplines relevant to the DoD listed below, at a US institution of their choice.

The Fellowship pays for full tuition and all mandatory fees, a monthly stipend, travel, and health insurance

An applicant's degree program must align with the following broad research area disciplines:
